- _____ BRIDE AND FATHER DANCE Before dinner (recommended) After dinner

Single women are invited to the dance floor to catch the Bride's bouquet.

Time

- _____ GARTER REMOVAL/TOSS (usually after bouquet toss)
Groom removes garter from seated Bride and tosses it to the single men.
The Stripper - Mission Impossible Theme - Oh, Yeah - Another One Bites the Dust
- _____ GARTER ON (optional)
Man who caught garter places it on leg of woman who caught bouquet (if appropriate).
- _____ MONEY DANCE OR GOOD LUCK DANCE (optional)
Male guests dance with Bride while female guests dance with Groom. Newlyweds slow dance with each guest 20-30 seconds. Guests may give a dollar (or more) to the newlyweds as a gesture of support for their marriage or honeymoon. Best man and maid of honor assist.
- _____ PARTY DANCES (optional)
These group dances are crowd pleasers and get all ages up on the dance floor. Circle the ones you want played. Cross out any you do not want played, even if requested by your guests.
*Electric Slide - Cha Cha Slide - Cupid Shuffle - Macarena - YMCA - Chicken Dance - Hokey Pokey
